The Executive has come up with some ideas which may encourage you as archers and members of the association to participate in the NZFAA League rounds and encourage your Club Executive and fellow members to give it a go.

The Executive has reintroduced the League Series Rounds with points to go to Shooter of the Year in each division – information on this further into the newsletter.

The Club Trophy has been reintroduced at League Series Rounds and Nationals – information further into the newsletter.


2011 sees the IFAA World Bowhunter Championships in Australia and it is the hope of the Executive to take our largest team to Australia.

To qualify as part of the team some of the criteria is as follows check the separate information sheet.

- Attendance at NZFAA League Series both Marked & Unmarked
- Attendance at the NZFAA Nationals both Marked and Unmarked and be placed in your division.
- Shoot qualifying scores which will be posted with all the information for the event in a separate flyer.

NZ Records will now have to reach a score to be recognised as a NZ Record – The Registrar is currently formulating the information required and we will advise as soon as it is ratified by the Executive.

NZFAA LEAGUE SERIES – SHOOTER OF THE YEAR

In keeping with the theme of “PARTICIPATION” the leagues series and National Events have been set up to cover both disciplines and the winner of each division will be awarded points and at the end of the year the title of “Shooter of the Year” will be awarded to the winner of each division.

There are 3 unmarked league rounds, 2 marked rounds and Nationals for IFAA and Bowhunter. The criteria is as follows – You must shoot the following:

- 2 unmarked league rounds
- 2 marked league rounds
- IFAA Nationals – each round award points
- Bowhunter Nationals – each round award points

CLUB TROPHY

The club trophy will be awarded at the end of each league round based on the total score shot by all archers from the one club. This will also be awarded at the National Events. Points for each win will be allocated and the top club will be the club with the most points at the end of the year. Clubs you should encourage as many of your members to attend these rounds to be the best Club in New Zealand.

IFAA WORLD BOWHUNTERS (WBHC) 17TH-20TH April 2011 – Wagga Wagga, Australia.

The Executive is working towards a large team taking part at this event. Include bulk travel, accommodation etc. Prices etc will be forwarded to the Clubs and placed on the NZFAA website. At this early stage all questions etc will need to be directed to the Secretary until we set up a sub-committee to manage this event.

All archers are entitled to attend this event providing they are current financial members of an affiliated NZFAA club. Members must register their intent to go this World Event so please forward your advice to the Secretary as soon as possible.

Team selection – this will be based on “PARTICIPATION” - attending the League series as shown on this page is a huge part of team selection. Qualifying scores also will need to be met and these will be set by a Selection Committee to be elected at the next committee meeting and information sorted and posted out as soon as possible thereafter.

This is a great opportunity for our members – as it is on our doorstep and it is a long time before another World Event is to be held in the Southern Hemisphere.
