

## NZFAA Team selection for International events.

To be eligible for National Team selection Archers must:

1. Be current, fully paid and affiliated members of the NZFAA.
2. Have resided in NZ for a period of 30 days in the previous 12 months, or be a national of NZ by birth or naturalisation.
3. Have not shot as a member of another nation's team in the same 12 month period.
4. Register with National Registrar their intention to attend an International tournament confirming the shooting style for the event and interest in National team selection.
5. Compete regularly at NZFAA events in the preceding 12 month period producing scores relevant for International event to specified shooting style. These scores will be used for the purpose of grading of archer as per Article VII(B) IFAA grading rules and classifications for the International event.
6. Meet the requirements set in the selection process for participation and attaining relevant qualifying scores

In the situation where an archer wishes to compete in a new IFAA shooting style and change from the previous year, they must notify the National Registrar and produce a new series of scores under the new style to complete grading and selection process.

For IFAA events Archers are required to present an authorized IFAA Score and classification card, recording a history of events and grading provisions for their registered shooting style, which also indicates a working knowledge of the event and IFAA rules and regulations.

It should be noted that to compete at IFAA international events archers must be a member of an IFAA affiliated organisation – NZFAA, and are archers often registering and making payments well in advance of National Team selection process.

There is no restriction by NZFAA to prevent members from attending any International event but continued membership is reliant on the archers conduct and not bringing NZFAA or NZ into disrepute.

All archers must abide with the IFAA Basic Code of conduct for competitors at the event.

### Selection process

The NZFAA executive committee shall appoint a minimum of three selectors, one being the National Registrar.

The selectors will adjudicate and present their selection to the NZFAA executive committee for approval ideally 2 months prior to the International Event.

For WFAC and WBHC the selectors will determine the:

- National Team - Individual shooting style
- Champion of Nations Team
- Style teams (where applicable)

The selection period will typically be the preceding 12 months prior to the Event.

Team selection cut of date to be nominated for each event.

Archers should attend NZFAA events to attain scores for grading purposes in their specified shooting style. This also provide history for selectors to consider as part of selection process.

All registered archers should be able to show steady improvement in scores and working towards and or attaining A grade Archer in their respective shooting style under Article VII(B) IFAA grading rules/classifications.

Other International events – Archers should approach NZFAA executive to consider forming a National Team for other events. Ranking and placings should follow a similar procedure for National team selection.

### **National Team – Individual shooting style**

Archers must attend the NZFAA marked nationals or NZFAA Bowhunter nationals preceding the International event.

Archers must have attained scores at a minimum of 3 of the qualifying Events posting a best scores for each of the following:

WFAC - Field, Hunter and marked Animal round

WBHC – Standard 3D, Hunter 3D, unmarked animal

Where qualifying events are 14 target rounds the best score will be calculated using the first 14 target series score times by two to give a 28 target equivalent round best score.

The selection panel will be looking for the top archers in each shooting style based on the following criteria:

- Individuals ranking score using their best score for the three rounds at either NZFAA nationals or qualifying events using the **ranking assessment calculation procedure**
- All best scores are Ideally A grades scores for each round
- Recognizing developing skills in some divisions Both the Nationals' scores and qualifying scores must achieve the minimum nominated "B" grade style qualification scores

Other factors for panel to consider are:

- The Archer's current ranking in their IFAA shooting style in the NZFAA ranking, during the year prior to team selection.
- The Archer's placing in their IFAA shooting style at the appropriate national tournament during the year prior to team selection.
- Demonstration of dedication and commitment in working towards becoming a team member.
- Demonstration of results improvement in working towards achieving any set qualifying scores, or shooting style ranking or placing at NZFAA events.
- The Archers prior history of good character, behavior, sportsmanship and demeanor being deemed suitable to positively represent New Zealand and the NZFAA at an International Tournament.

Should an archer for valid reasons be unable to attend qualifying events or the NZFAA Nationals

to provide best scores for each of the three rounds the archer can make an applications in writing requesting dispensation for selection into National team. This will be considered by selection panel where upon any decision made is final.

As a guideline for selectors:

- Ideally all selections will be A grade Archers.
- For divisions with 10 or more competitors registered the top 5 ranked competitors may be selected.
- For divisions with less than 10 competitors registered the top 3 ranked competitors may be selected.
- If there is only one competitor in a division then they must achieve the minimum B grade qualification score for all rounds, ideally achieve A grade qualification scores for all rounds to be considered for selection.
- Achieving A grade scores does not mean automatic selection.

Champion of Nations team and style teams will use the same Ranking assessment procedure for National team but have their own selection procedures as defined.

## **Administration**

To complete selection Archers must be registered, paid and accepted to attend International event.

Team selection will be announced desirably no later than 2 months prior to event and presented with a certificate of selection.

Should an Archer have to withdraw from the International event then the next ranked attending competitor may be selected to take their place.

Team members will order and pay all costs for official team uniform and sign and abide by NZFAA code of conduct at event.

NZFAA will register and pay for specific team entry at the event for Champion of Nations and style teams

## **Uniform:**

The official uniform for NZFAA members at International Events is the NZFAA Black Arrows shirt with trademarked logo and accompanied cap. No additions and or alterations can be made to official uniform without NZFAA executive approval.

All NZFAA participants at International Events are encouraged to purchase the official NZFAA Black arrow uniform.

All National team members will have "National Team" and their "Name" added to official NZFAA Black arrow shirt.

All Champion of Nations members will have "Champion of Nations" added to official National Team members NZFAA Black arrow shirt.

All style team members are encouraged to wear the official NZFAA Black arrow uniform.



## Ranking assessment calculation example - WFAC

Archers ranking score = (Field best score/style world record x 100) + (hunter best score/style world record x 100) + (Animal best score/ style world record x100)

### Division – AMFU

Current World records for division

- Field round – 558
- Hunter Round – 558
- Marked animal round – 560

Archer 1 – best scores from either NZFAA Nationals and or Qualifying event

- Field round – 515
- Hunter Round – 506
- Marked Animal Round – 539

Archer 1 Ranking score  
=  $515/558 \times 100 + 506/558 \times 100 + 539/560 \times 100$   
=  $92.29 + 90.68 + 96.25$   
= 279.22

Archer 2 – best scores from either NZFAA Nationals and or Qualifying event

- Field round – 528
- Hunter Round – 510
- Marked Animal Round – 520

Archer 2 Ranking score  
=  $528/558 \times 100 + 510/558 \times 100 + 520/560 \times 100$   
=  $94.62 + 91.40 + 92.86$   
= 278.88

Archer 3 – best scores from either NZFAA Nationals and or Qualifying event

- Field round – 505
- Hunter Round – 528
- Marked Animal Round – 525

Archer 3 Ranking score  
=  $505/558 \times 100 + 528/558 \times 100 + 525/560 \times 100$   
=  $90.50 + 94.62 + 93.75$   
= 278.87

### So for division AMFU:

Archer 1 – ranks 1st 279.22

Archer 2 –ranks 2<sup>nd</sup> - 278.88

Archer 3 ranks 3<sup>rd</sup> - 278.87

The selection process will favour those Archers with scores attempting to reach or better the nominated “A” grade style qualification score as defined in attachment – Selection scores

Where ranking events are 14 target rounds the best score will calculated using the first 14 target series score times by two to give a 28 target equivalent round best score.

The style world record shall be the latest value at start of selection period as indicated in attachment – Selection scores.

Any subsequent world record changes will only affect those divisions that do not currently have a world record.

In the event the archer exceeds the world record value for any one of the specified rounds then their maximum score for that round shall be 100.00.

Scores will be rounded up to 2 decimal places.

In the event no World record exists then the selection team will determine an appropriate score to be the substitute world record value.

Archers with same ranking score across the three round types will be positioned on their Field Round best score.

Example:

- Archer 1 AMBU – ranking score 256 – Field best score 525
- Archer 2 AMBU – ranking score 256 – Field best score 528

Archer 2 ranks higher position for AMBU division.



## Style Teams

Style Team's selection will only be made if there are sufficient registered participants to meet IFAA style Team provisions. Style teams are not always applicable at all IFAA events.

The style team provisions will be defined in the latest IFAA rules.

Selection will be based upon individual ranking assessment in each style with top three highest ranking assessment scores used to determine each style team.

Only amateur Male and Female, Young adults, Adults and Veterans in each style are able to be selected for a Style Team.

Professional's, juniors and cubs are not entitled to be selected for a style team.

A style team is made up of 3 archers, male or female, shooting in same style eg BU – Bowhunter unlimited.

An option for a fourth position is registered should an archer from top three have to retire from event.

The combined individual scores for all three archers at the event form the team score and compete against other International style teams.

Style teams can be made up with registered NZFAA archers that have not been selected as part of the National Team and or Champion of Nations team.

More than one team can be entered for a style.

NZFAA style teams will be registered and paid for by NZFAA.

## PRFAC Trans-Tasman Team

The Team for this event are made up on the closing day for the event where the Entry registrations are completed and divisions are known.

Where practical teams should encompass as many competitors as possible from each country as long as there is a reciprocal competitor from both countries in their respective division.

Example : if there are 5 AFBU in one country and 3 from the other, then the Teams will consist of 3 AFBU from each country.

Team selection chooses best ranked archer from NZ and Australia where there are respective competitors in each division.

Each Nations team score is the combined score for each individual for the whole event, compared against the other Nation.

The winning team is the Nation with the highest combined score and gets presented with the Trans-Tasman trophy and certificates.

Team selection for NZ will be based upon the individual Ranking assessment and or National ranking to select the top archer for each division attending the event.

Team selection will be undertaken by National Registrar and approved by NZFAA executive.

There will be no official uniform for Trans-Tasman team

Trans-Tasman team entry will be registered and paid for by NZFAA





## Champion of Nations Team

Champion of Nation's team selection will only be made if there are sufficient registered participants to meet IFAA Champion of Nations provisions. The team provisions will be defined in the latest IFAA rules.

Selection will be based upon latest world records and use the individual ranking assessment in each style with highest value used to determine style positions within the team.

The Minimum members of a team consist of 4 archers:

- 1 from either FU or BU style
- 1 from FSC, FSR or BL style
- 1 from BBR,BBC,BHR,BHC,or TR style
- 1 from LB or HB style

The Maximum members of a team consist of 9 archers:

- 1 from FU and 1 from BU styles
- 1 from FSC or FSR and 1 from BL styles
- 1 form BBR or BBC and 1 from BHR or BHC and 1 from TR styles
- 1 from LB and 1 from HB styles

Amateur Male and female, Young adults, Adults and Veterans in each style are compared against each other for a position in the team. Professional's, juniors and cubs are not entitled to be selected for Champion of nation's team.

Selection for positions will come from the top ranked individual for each division.

The selection process will compare across styles and select the highest ranked archer using their individual ranking assessment.

Selection will favour those that can score closest to world records values in their division.

Example:

For Group 1, Unlimited styles – FU position

- Archer 1 - YAMFU ranking score 295
- Archer 2 - AMFU ranking score 260
- Archer 3 - VFFU ranking score 262

Archer 1 - YAMFU will be selected to represent FU position in Champion of Nations team.

The champion of Nations team members will shoot as individuals with their scores being compared with their division world record to determine each archers ranking score in each of the four groups. The team score is the top best four group scores added together and which is then ranked against other Champion of Nation teams.

NZFAA Champion of Nation's team will be registered and paid for by NZFAA.



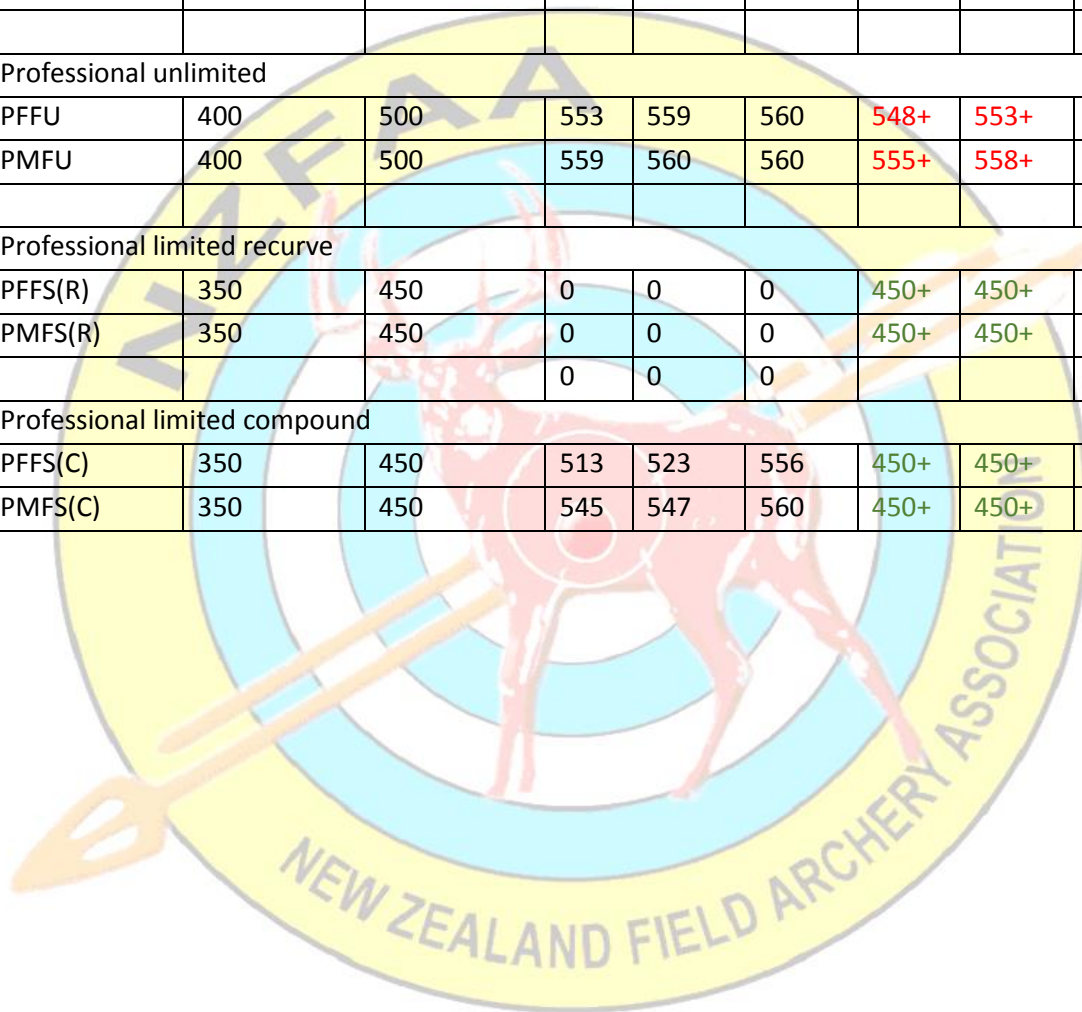
