WIAC2019 update – January 2019

Registrations

To date there are 166 archers registered to attend the WIAC2019 and compete to become a World Champion. 115 of these are NZFAA members.

If you haven't registered yet it's worth doing so you don't miss out. Registrations close 31st January 2019 but may be extended if we have not reached the capped numbers 320 archers.

In order to be eligible to compete at the WIAC2019 archers must:

- Be a current NZFAA member
- Complete minimum of 2 indoor rounds at an IFAA or NZFAA sanctioned events and or the NZFAA postal series that will be recorded on your IFAA score and classification card.

We encourage you to register for the WIAC2019 as soon as you are able – there is no need to have the 2 indoor rounds under your belt to register but must be done to be eligible to compete.

Note: There is no selection process for Kiwis to attend this event, just have to have competed in a NZFAA event registering the 2 scores.

Sanctioned Event Update

NZFAA wish to thank Mt Tiger Archers, Gisborne Archery Club, Mana Archery Club, Mountain Green Archery Club and Greenwood Archery Club for Hosting Sanctioned Indoor events.

In doing so they have facilitated 112 members to attain the 2 scores necessary for eligibility to attend the WIAC2019. There are another 38 that have only shot one score.

If you haven't got your scores then you need to attend the up and coming sanctioned events or convince your club to do the NZFAA postal series for January and February.

NZFAA Postal series update

There has only been a small number of clubs have had a go at the postal series.

If you can't attend the scheduled sanctioned events then this is another option to get the 2 scores for eligibility to attend the WIAC2019.

To date we have 3 clubs have submitted scores for the November/December period.

If you need more help and assistance with postal series

Score and Classification cards

For the WIAC 2019 the requirement is to present an IFAA score and classification card to show archers have competed in the rounds being shot at event showing they have the experience and understanding of the rules and regulations for the event.

NZFAA will issue score and classification cards to those WIAC2019 registered NZFAA members via their club representatives just prior to the event.

NZFAA will also have the archer's data base report showing each archers participation at events.

In order to compete at the WIAC2019 archers must:

- Be a current NZFAA member
- Complete minimum of 2 indoor rounds at IFAA or NZFAA sanctioned events and or the NZFAA postal series that will be recorded on your IFAA score and classification card

IFAA Rules

IFAA has issued a new Book of rules which have taken effect as at 1 January 2019.

One of the big changes is in the shooting divisions:

- There is a new division called Seniors aged 65 and above
- Seniors can choose to shoot in either Adult, Veteran or Senior division
- Veteran age has changed to 55 to 64 years
- Adult age has changed to 21 to 54 years
- Young Adult age has changed to be 17 to 20 years
- Archers can now compete in all shooting styles

Hosting a Sanctioned Events – How it works

All clubs that have access to indoor facilities are encouraged to request to host a sanctioned indoor event. These events provide practical experience necessary for the WIAC2019.

No event is too big or small, it can be any day or night, during week or weekend, the host club decides the program.

Please contact the NZFAA secretary/registrar to formalise a sanctioned event request. The events will be run as follows:

- Host Clubs will enter into a hosting agreement
- NZFAA committee to work with host club to find a slot in the NZFAA event calendar
- Event must shoot the IFAA standard indoor round and do so under IFAA rules and bylaws
- Event must be open to all NZFAA members
- Archers are able to compete for record book result placings
- The Host club manages event and determine date, number of archers, rounds to be shot, fees etc. and run the event on the day
- NZFAA will publicise event on website, Facebook page and provide event flyers and registration forms with event details to affiliated clubs and members via committee reps and club contacts
- Archers will register and pay fees direct to host club
- Archers will undergo a registration and equipment inspection to confirm they are in correct division and shooting under IFAA rules.
- Archery NZ clubs and NZFAA clubs should request assistance from NZFAA to help with equipment inspection and event rules etc.

NZFAA Indoor postal series

To help those NZFAA registered archers that are not able to make the sanctioned indoor events, NZFAA has authorised a formal Indoor postal series as another means for archers to gain the necessary round experience for the WIAC2019.

The postal series is to be shot at local clubs on a standard club day, with a maximum of one event per month of the series. Date and time to be arranged by the club.

The round can be **shot outdoors** if clubs do not have access to indoor facilities.

The round to be shot is the IFAA standard indoor round, with one score submitted per archer per month.

Clubs will run event like a NZFAA League event including registration and formal gear inspection.

Each month Clubs will manage event and return to NZFAA Registrar the completed NZFAA postal event worksheet approved and submitted by club Captain/Representative on behalf of all archers.

This will include confirmation of payment of event fee of \$2/archer to NZFAA bank account.

Event Score cards are to be retained by club and made available to NZFAA if requested.

The indoor postal series will start November 2018 and run through to February 2019 – 4 rounds in total.

NZFAA Club reps/Club contacts please register your club participation in the Indoor postal series by contacting the NZFAA registrar and requesting a copy of the NZFAA postal event spreadsheet and event pack. Archerynz members through their local archery club should advise of participation and submit their scores to secretary@archerynz.co.nz

Postal series rules:

The indoor postal series will be run similar to the NZFAA league series.

- Double scoring on NZFAA standard indoor score card
- Score cards must be signed by Archer and witnessed
- Archers achieve points depending on their placing in their division
- 10 pts for first down to 1pt for 10th and below in each division.
- Tied positions will attain same level of points
- To be considered as league series winner archer must
 - Be a current NZFAA member
 - Shoot in the same division for all the series events
 - Shoot a minimum of 3 out of the 4 events
- If archer changes division they forfeit all previous series points
- Winners for each division will be presented a Postal series trophy.
- Postal series results will be posted on NZFAA website.
- Club must provide results no later than the 5th day of the month following.
- All Late entry results will not be accepted as part of Postal series but will be included as part of archers record.
- All rounds shot will be recorded in the NZFAA archer's database and be used as part of WIAC2019 score and classification card for those that are registered at this World Event.
